In those days, there was no problem for everyone to attend the same public school where Catholic nuns in "uniform" also taught. In 1923 Oregon passed the "garb bill," which prohibited public school teachers from wearing religious dress. This cooperative arrangement was followed in Sublimity: Grades 1, 2, and 3 were taught by the sisters in the Catholic school; grades 4, 5, and 6 were taught by district teachers in the public school, and grades 7 and 8 were taught by the sisters in the Catholic school. The district also rented a classroom in the Catholic school.
